5 Pillars of the Education Track

The Education & Technology track operates across five integrated pillars — each designed to leave something lasting. Together they form a comprehensive model for community education transformation that begins with this trip and extends far beyond it.

1	School Partnerships Adopt & serve local K–12 schools across all three cities.
2	Orphan Sponsorship Sponsor & walk with vulnerable children through Rise Church Kenya.
3	AI & Digital Literacy Hands-on AI and digital skills training for students at every level.
4	Equipment Donations Laptops, tablets, software, and classroom tech to partner schools.
5	University Partnerships Mentorship, campus lectures, student exchange, and institutional MOUs.

School Partnerships

Adopting Schools for Long-Term Impact

"We don't just visit schools. We adopt them."



School Assemblies

Team leads inspiring school-wide assemblies across all three cities — sharing vision, values, and encouragement at scale.



Adopt a School

Select schools are formally adopted — building ongoing relationships, providing resources, and committing to continued support. Adoption is a long-term promise, not a short-term gesture.



Classroom Engagement

Team members go directly into classrooms to lead sessions, share professional expertise, and connect students to a larger world of possibility.



Curriculum Support

Structured lesson plans, digital materials, and educational tools that teachers continue using after the team leaves — equipping teachers as well as students.

Orphan Sponsorship

Walking with Kenya's Most Vulnerable Children

Across Nairobi, Kakamega, and Mombasa, thousands of children grow up without parents, without stability, and without a clear path forward. Our orphan sponsorship initiative pairs committed sponsors with individual children through Rise Church Kenya for ongoing, personal support.

Direct Sponsorship

Sponsors cover education costs, school supplies, meals, and essential needs. Structured, consistent, and designed to provide real stability.

School Enrollment

We work with local partners to ensure every sponsored child is enrolled, attending consistently, and receiving the support they need to thrive.

Personal Connection

Sponsorships include letters, photos, and regular updates. This is not an anonymous transaction — it is a human relationship built on commitment and care.

Long-Term Commitment

Sponsorships continue for years — providing sustained stability that gives each child a genuine opportunity to build a future. The trip initiates. The relationship sustains.

AI & Digital Literacy Training

Putting the Tools of the Future in Kenyan Hands

IHA leads hands-on AI and digital literacy training for K–12 students and university learners across all three cities. These are practical, skills-based workshops — not awareness sessions — equipping students to use the tools of the modern economy right now, from digital basics to advanced AI applications.

Equipment & Supply Donations

"Technology access is not a luxury — it is a foundation."

Many Kenyan schools lack the basic technology needed to give students a competitive foundation. We arrive with supplies — and we leave lasting infrastructure. Every donated item is paired with training and support to ensure it is used, maintained, and impactful.

Laptops & Tablets

Donated directly to partner schools, pre-configured with educational software and learning platforms for students who have never had access to digital tools.

Software & Licenses

Learning platforms, productivity suites, and AI tools — licensed and installed to remove the cost barrier that typically limits Kenyan schools.

Educational Materials

Textbooks, workbooks, stationery, and classroom supplies for immediate use. Physical materials remain essential even in a digital learning environment.

Classroom Infrastructure

Projectors, wifi equipment, and presentation tools that transform individual classrooms — multiplying the impact of everything else.

University Partnerships

Building Bridges Between U.S. and Kenyan Higher Education

Kenya has a growing, talented university student population hungry for global networks, mentorship, and opportunities. Our university partnerships create structured pathways — connecting Kenyan students and faculty with international professionals and institutions for lasting academic and career partnerships.



Campus Visits & Lectures

Team members visit Kenyan universities to speak and lead workshops in business, healthcare, technology, and ministry — investing in Kenya's next generation of leaders.



Student Mentorship Programs

One-on-one and group mentorship pairings connecting Kenyan students with international professionals — structured to continue via video calls and email beyond the trip.



Institutional Partnerships

Formal MOU frameworks between U.S. and Kenyan universities — establishing student exchange, joint research, and shared academic resources that outlast any individual trip.



Career Pathway Development

Practical sessions on entrepreneurship, graduate school preparation, and accessing global opportunities — giving students concrete, actionable next steps from exactly where they are.

What Success Looks Like

We measure impact by what changes in students' lives — not just what happens during the 16 days of the trip. The trip is the beginning. These are the markers we are building toward.

During the Trip

- School assemblies delivered across all three cities
- AI and digital literacy sessions completed with K–12 and university students
- Laptops and supplies delivered to partner schools
- Orphan sponsorships initiated and confirmed
- University campus visits and lectures held
- Mentorship pairings established between students and international professionals
- Curriculum resources handed to teachers for ongoing use

After the Trip

- Adopted schools receiving ongoing curriculum support, supplies, and mentorship
- Sponsored children attending school consistently, supported by personal sponsors
- Mentorship relationships continuing year-round
- University partnerships producing student exchanges and joint academic initiatives
- Technology infrastructure in active daily classroom use
- Teachers applying IHA curriculum materials independently
- A repeatable, scalable model for annual education impact
